

LONG STAY

The long-stay visa, which constitutes a residency document, allows an extended stay in France for a period of more than 90 days.

French Territorial Overseas Communities (CTOM)

No visa shall be issued if the applicant is already living in France.

Personal appearance is mandatory for all applicants to file the visa application and to pick up the visa.

- All documents have to be in original and copy*. Consular section does not make any copy
- All foreign documents must be translated in French by a certified translator compliant
- Missing document (original or copy) = incomplete file = high risk of visa refusal;
- The application fee is not refundable): 99.- € - for each applicant payable only cash

<input type="checkbox"/>	1.	The present list of documents on which you will have ticked each document attached and copies.
<input type="checkbox"/>	2.	Two <u>long stay visa forms</u> : Forms must be completely and legibly filled in with black or blue ink, dated and signed by the applicant.
<input type="checkbox"/>	3.	Two identity photos with french norms : the photos must be recent (less than three months), in color on a clear background, taken from the front, passport size – 35mm x 45mm, clearly showing the face, the forehead hairline and ears. To check the size please consult : <u>Photos</u>
<input type="checkbox"/>	4.	Passport in good condition , with a date of expiration at least 3 months after the end of the student's proposed stay in France, issued within the past 10 years and containing at least 2 blank pages. The visa is validated by a self-adhesive label that will be affixed to one of the pages of the passport (copy of principal pages). The passport will be returned the day of your deposit request.
<input type="checkbox"/>	5.	A Austria, Hungarian, Czech, Slovak, Slovenia residence permit valid at the time of filing the application until the entry in France.
<input type="checkbox"/>	6.	Extract from the police record of countries where the applicant has resided during the past three years + copy
<input type="checkbox"/>	7.	A medical certificate

<input type="checkbox"/>	8.	The degrees and the CV in french for the position contemplated + photocopy
<input type="checkbox"/>	9.	Work contract or promise of employment specifying the job, salary, weekly duration of work, the true location of employment and references by the employer
<input type="checkbox"/>	10.	At the same time, your employer must apply for a work authorization from the appropriate CTOM authorities
If you do not wish to work (visitor)		
<input type="checkbox"/>	11.	Supporting evidence of revenue allowing a stay in a CTOM without working. (Future revenue of the applicant- bank confirmation – living accommodations)
<input type="checkbox"/>	12.	Evidence of an accomodation
<input type="checkbox"/>	13.	Evidence of applicant's medical coverage : the document which confirms social security during applicant's stay in the CTOM with a travel insurance covering repatriation costs for medical reasons, emergency medical and hospital care valid for the duration of the stay. Contact your Insurer and file a document clearly outlining such coverage
<input type="checkbox"/>	14.	Application fees (non-refundable) : 99 € payable only cash

Note

The delivered visa is a three-month D-Visa. After receiving it, you must apply for a resident card where you will live.

* A scanned document is not considered an original document.

** Delays are variable according to the nationality (15 days to 2 months)
